### Sector Stakeholder Groups

We are inviting individuals and organisations from across the eligible Taith sectors (Schools, Youth, Adult Education, Further Education and Vocational Education and Training and Higher Education) to join our Sector Stakeholder groups. We are continually looking to develop and improve Taith, and stakeholder consultation and input is an essential part of this. As grant recipients we'd like to invite you to join us on these virtual meetings.

The role of the groups will be to:

- Represent the views of their organisation and others within their sector in relation to the continuing development and delivery of the Taith programme, including policy, processes, and communication.
- Provide feedback on ways of working and approaches to design, development, delivery, and impact of the programme.
- Identify and highlight barriers to participation within the relevant sector and provide feedback/advice on how the programme can meet its strategic priorities around inclusion and accessibility.
- Share insights and updates on relevant developments within their sector and alignment with sector priorities.

The next meeting is on **Tuesday 16 April 12:00-13:00** and is a cross sectoral meeting to discuss underrepresented groups and participants. It is therefore open to all of our sectors: Schools, Youth, Adult Education, Further Education and Vocational Education and Training and Higher Education.

**Additional Funding and Project Change requests:** Changes to request forms  
You will have recently received an email explaining that reporting changes to planned mobilities should now be completed in the proforma, which is saved in your Taith project folder.

Any changes to contacts or consortia must still be requested through the Change Request Form.

The process for applying for additional funding for Inclusion Support or Green Travel payments has not changed. The forms for both processes can be found on the [Grant Recipient area](#) of the Taith website.

However, over the coming weeks you will notice that the forms will look different as we switch them over to a different hosting platform. The information and questions will remain the same, but if you have any questions at all, or require any support to access the forms on the new system, please contact us and we will arrange for a member of the team to assist you.



## Two-week mobilities

We understand that, as part of ongoing Pathway 1 projects, some Grant Recipients have already completed multiple individual learner mobilities that only meet the minimum 14-day duration when including travel days, for all sectors. This also applies to group learner mobilities for Higher Education projects.

We appreciate that the guidance we've provided on this matter has been open to interpretation, therefore we will accept individual learner mobilities that are a minimum of 14 days, including a maximum of 2 travel days for both Pathway 1 2022 and Pathway 1 2023 call years, for all sectors. We will also accept this for Higher Education group learner mobilities.

## Updates to Participant reporting datasets

From April 2024, you will be required to report on the following datasets:

- County
- Welsh domiciled
- Participant's postcode (For HE students this should be their home address postcode, rather than their term time postcode)

For P1 2022 projects that have previously provided data on a participant's county and Welsh domiciled status, this information will be put back into your report for all data submitted by 31st October 2023. You will now be required to request this information from participants.

We will be updating your live participant reporting tool in the coming weeks to include these new datasets. In the meantime, if you have any concerns or questions, please do let us know.
